Firetruck gets a new home

With that in mind, GPL's entry area near the Circulation Desk was recently rearranged to include the much-loved firetruck.

For those unfamiliar with this important piece of GPL mem-

orabilia, the firetruck has been a part of our library since 1998 when it was built and donated by local firefighters. It includes two child-sized bench seats and four shelves the perfect size for displaying children's books.

The firetruck isn't the only thing that's moved in the Children's area. New books are now located just inside the main entrance next to the firetruck, taking the place of

the emergent readers.

The emergent readers have been relocated to the Children's area where the biographies were once shelved, and the biography section is near the children's computers where the new books were formerly housed.

Children's magazines can now be found in the windows around the room, near the chapter books.
